

The Asian Development Bank–Japan Scholarship (ADB–JSP)

The Asian Development Bank-Japan Scholarship program provides full scholarship support for Master's degree study in ADB-JSP approved fields of study at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa and for participation in the educational, residential, and leadership development programs at the East-West Center. The scholarship includes round-trip airfare from home country, full tuition and fees, housing at the East-West Center, a book allowance, health insurance and a monthly stipend.

ADB-JSP was established to strengthen human resource capacity in Asian Development Bank developing member countries. After completing their studies, scholars are expected to return to their home countries to apply and share their new knowledge and skills to promote socioeconomic development.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Be a citizen and current resident of a developing member country of the Asian Development Bank and not more than 35 years old at the time of application.
- Have a 4-year bachelor's degree or the equivalent of a 4-year Bachelor's degree, at the time of application. Have at least 2 years of full-time professional work experience after a university degree at the time of application.
- Applicants must be living or working in their home country at the time of application and participation.
