

Announcement of Naresuan University on "Guidelines for Teaching and Working as Preventive Measures Against Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) Pandemic" (2/2021)

With the spread of COVID-19 in a vast number of provinces and infected cases have significantly increased, Naresuan University hereby announces the following measures to cope with the pandemic:

- Cessation of conventional teaching is to be extended until January 31, 2021, and online or distant learning will be the only mode of teaching delivery.
- 2. For professional training/training under cooperative education project, it is advised that Faculties/Schools strictly continue in line with COVID-19 preventive measures.
- 3. Dormitories for staff and students are to be closely investigated; cleaning of areas and shared equipment and apparatus, including arranging for better ventilation in the place will be regularly conducted. Respecting distancing among individuals has to be strictly practiced.
- 4. All staff members and students must fill out both the NU Screening Form and relevant form(s) issued by the Phitsanulok Provincial Health Office as directed by the university.
- 5. Those who have track records of making contacts with either fragile cases or infected cases or having fever, cough, sore throat, running nose, and hyposmia/anosmia are advised to head to Acute Respiratory Clinic (ARI Clinic) of the Naresuan University Hospital on office hours from 08.00-16.00
- 6. It is strictly recommended staff members and students cancel or delay traveling beyond Phitsanulok border unless a strongly sound reason is given and approved by Deans/Directors of Schools/Directors of Divisions.
- 7. Faculties/Schools/Faculty Equivalent Unit(s) come up with Work from Home (WFH) measures by initiating selective working hours (primarily based on 8-hour office hours), social distancing, et cetera.
